## **Bill: HB 59 – Fireworks Modifications**

## Bill: HB 64 – Public Official Bonding Amendments

This Bill amends provisions relating to bonds required for public officials and employees to protect against malfeasance or misfeasance in office and replaces the requirement to post a bond with a requirement to obtain crime insurance.

Outcome: HB 64 passed out of the House and will be sent to the Senate for further consideration.

Bill: 1st substitute HB 269 – Privacy Protections in Sex-Designated Areas

Sponsor: Representative Stephanie Gricius Floor Sponsor: Senator Brady Brammer

**UASD Position: Tracking** 

This Bill modifies provisions regarding sex-designated privacy spaces in education and government facilities.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill. Representative G. Miller spoke in opposition to the Bill and stated her belief that this should be addressed by each institution of higher education and not by the Legislature. Representatives Owens and Hayes expressed similar concerns. Representatives Peck, Fiefia, Lee, Cutler, Ivory, Shelley, and Robert spoke in support of 1st Substitute HB 269 and believe that there needs to be clear lines set on privacy regarding trans individuals.

Yeas: 59 Nays:13 N/V: 3

Outcome: 1<sup>st</sup> substitute HB 269 passed out of the House and will be sent to the Senate for further consideration.
