Discussion: Representative Acton presented the Bill. There was no discussion on the floor.

Bill: 1<sup>st</sup> Substitute HB 275 – First Responder Volunteer Tax Credit Sponsor: Representative Logan Monson Floor Sponsor: TBD UASD Position: Support

This Bill enacts an income tax credit for first responder volunteers.

Discussion: Representative Monson introduced the Bill. Representative Mike Peterson inquired whether volunteer first responders receive any compensation. The sponsor clarified that some groups offer stipends, but not contracted hours. Representative Peterson also asked about the Bill's motivation, to which the sponsor explained that constituents had requested it due to the difficulty of recruiting volunteers in rural areas and the need to offer more than just gratitude. Peterson further questioned whether volunteers receiving compensation could still be considered

volunteers and how stipend amounts are determined. The sponsor responded that the stipend is minimal and does not alter the volunteer status, with amounts varying by county.
